

HNC APPLIED SCIENCES PATHWAY TO MEDICINE AT PERTH COLLEGE
PROGRESSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY TO MEDICINE AT ST ANDREWS

1. There are up to five places reserved on the BSc Hons in Medicine course at the Medical School of the University of St Andrews for students on the Perth Pathway to Medicine. Students who graduate are then allocated a place on the MBChB course at one of our partner schools. Candidates who complete the Pathway will be presented to the University of St Andrews to be considered for progression.
2. Only those students who have passed the HNC at the level prescribed below will be considered and the following will be taken into account when deciding which students should progress:
 - a. Academic performance in the HNC
 - b. Reference from the HNC Course Team
 - c. UKCAT score (UKCAT to be sat in summer of the year before entry to Medicine)
 - d. 2nd interview carried out by Medical staff from St Andrews”
3. Requirements for consideration:
 - a. Complete ALL 15 credits.
 - b. Pass all the units at 60% and obtain a minimum grade of 70% in the following units:
 - i. Fundamentals of Chemistry: Theory & Practice
 - ii. Fundamentals of Chemistry: An Introduction
 - iii. Fundamental concepts of Organic Chemistry
 - iv. Cell Biology: Theory & Practice
 - v. DNA Structure & Function
 - vi. Human Body Structure & Function
 - c. Obtain a B pass in the Graded Unit - Investigation. Students will normally be allowed one re-sit in a maximum of two units.
 - d. Obtain a recommendation from their tutor at the end of the HNC.
 - e. Carry out relevant work experience in a medical field, ‘caring’ environment or voluntary sector by the time of completion of the HNC course at Perth.
